#### Against

- For -
- Good incentive to live a good life
  - Hope that death is not the end
  - Helps Christians believe that there is a point to worshipping God

Against - If a Christian only believed in the afterlife they would not live in accordance to God's gift of free will.

Belief in just the afterlife and no other teachings disrupts balance and clouds a Christian's judgement leading to an overall negative outcome

- Belief in God because without that, no religion
