Adult Learning at Eirias

November and <u>1Message</u> recently delivered **motivational talks** around crime and the consequences of our actions to all year groups 7-11.

- Our affiliation with the North Wales CAMH School In Reach Service helps us with our offer of early intervention support to children who are struggling with their mental health. They've also donated a selection of **books on a range of mental health topics**. These books can be found in our school library.
- We've secured grant funding to enhance the provision of our children with additional learning needs (ALN). This funding is being used to create an outdoor classroom and exercise garden behind E Block. The project is now under way and is coming together nicely! (pictured left)
- Conwy Local Authority are supporting us with **substantial repair work to A Block**. The Health & Safety of learners and staff are at the forefront of all plans and decisions and once an agreed plan is in place, we will of course share this with you with an estimated time for project completion.

We are delighted to start offering free adult courses at Ysgol Eirias! These learning opportunities will run outside of school hours and include: Cooking on a Budget, Internet Safety, Running Your Own Business, as well as GCSE Maths and English Support which are for adults looking to gain GCSEs or to support children with them.
