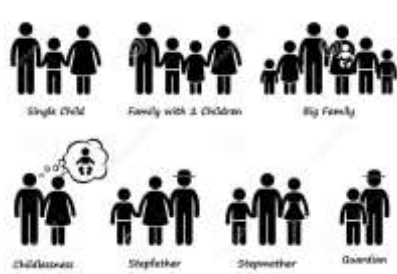

Why take Sociology?

- You will study how the superficial society is actually organised and determines how we experience life differently depending on factors such as your gender, ethnicity, age and class. If you like to delve into who, why, what and how people behave the way they do, this is the subject for you. Sociology is an exciting opportunity to investigate the intricacies of everyday life and how each of our behaviours are the product of our society and interactions within this.
- Sociology prepares you for a lifetime of change by developing your appreciation of the complexity and diversity of human behaviour, social organisation and the institutions, cultures and rules that govern society. You develop a cross cultural understanding of the world and this helps you to look objectively at the society you live in. You will employ different sociological theories and research methods in order to evaluate aspects of society such as education, health, crime and social inequality.

Future Careers

- Studying sociology opens up a wide range of careers in areas such as welfare, education, social research, local and central government, as well as law, the media and NHS and police services.
